Project Overview

The City of Abilene seeks funding from the US Department of Transportation for funding available through the Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) program. The City's Infrastructure and Economic Development Project seeks to increase community connectivity, economic competitiveness, partnership, and collaboration by enhancing infrastructure around the I-70/ Exit 272 route.

This opportunity is a discretionary BIL program that has a local match requirement of 10%. Abilene is requesting \$1,100,000 from the Build Kansas Fund. This request has the potential to unlock \$9,900,000.00 in federal funds.

The deadline for RAISE applications is February 28, 2024. The Build Kansas Fund application was received on February 2, 2024.

Advancing Abilene: Infrastructure & Economic Development Project Executive Summary

Background:

In the early 1990s, the Abilene Economic Development Council identified the area along Kansas I-70/Exit 272 as ideal for industrial development. The City of Abilene procured 60 acres of farmland, leading to the successful recruitment of a \$30 million Russell Stover plant in 1993, a significant contributor to the city's employment landscape.

However, despite this success, subsequent development has been limited. With only Love's Travel Stop added in 2018, the Abilene Industrial Park faces stagnation and missed economic development opportunities due to inadequate infrastructure and connectivity, making it financially burdensome for businesses to establish operations.

Current Status:

Traffic data from the Kansas Department of Transportation's 2022 Traffic Flow Map reveals substantial traffic along I-70/Exit 272, surpassing counts in other comparable communities. Abilene's 2024-2025 Comprehensive Plan underscores the need for further industrial development, particularly on the west side, near the Fair Road interchange.

The City's 2024-2025 Comprehensive Plan also highlights the concentration of industrial land use within Abilene, emphasizing the potential for growth and economic impact with strategic planning. The west side, including the Golden Belt Heights subdivision, is earmarked for residential and commercial expansion, making it a focal point for future development.

Future Vision:

To facilitate this vision, the proposed project aims to enhance infrastructure and

connectivity:



This application meets RAISE Grant Criteria:

Water Infrastructure:

 Raise Grant Eligibility: projects to replace or rehabilitate a culvert or prevent stormwater runoff for the purpose of improving habitat for aquatic species while advancing the goals of the RAISE program. Estimated Cost: \$3 million.

Surface Infrastructure & Connectivity:

 Raise Grant Eligibility: highway or bridge projects eligible under title 23, United States Code. public transportation projects eligible under chapter 53 of title 49, United States Code. Estimated Cost: \$8 million.

Additional criteria: Any other surface transportation infrastructure project that the Secretary considers to be necessary to advance the goals of the program. For example) RAISE projects are rigorously reviewed and evaluated on statutory criteria of safety, environmental sustainability, quality of life, mobility and community connectivity, economic competitiveness and opportunity including tourism, state of good repair, partnership and collaboration, and innovation.

This project will increase community connectivity, economic competitiveness, partnership and collaboration.

Residential Development Statistics:

The city-owned Golden Belt Heights housing development on the east and west sides shows promising growth with new homes constructed and lots sold. Since 2022, 48 out of 116 lots have been sold, reserved, or built on. This, coupled with the proposed infrastructure improvements, positions Abilene, Dickinson County, and the State of Kansas to leverage economic development opportunities for the foreseeable future.

In conclusion, the "Advancing Abilene: Infrastructure & Economic Development Project" represents a crucial initiative to bolster Abilene's economic prospects, fostering growth and connectivity for years to come.
