Project Overview

Under the Rural Surface Transportation Program, the U.S. Department of Transportation will provide funding to improve and expand the surface transportation infrastructure in rural areas to increase connectivity, improve the safety and reliability of the movement of people and freight, generate regional economic growth, and improve quality of life. The Dodge City – US 56 Corridor Project focuses on improving safety and expanding infrastructure to increase economic activity in the region, which includes National Beef, Cargill Meat Solutions, and soon, Hilmar Cheese plants. The project proposes improvements where three highways (US-56, US-400, US-283), converge and cross BNSF Railway, in addition to other expansion and efficiency efforts.

This opportunity is a discretionary BIL program with a local match requirement of 20% of the total project cost. The entity is requesting \$7,620,280.00 from the Build Kansas Fund. This request has the potential to unlock \$40,641,492.00 in federal funds.

The federal deadline was May 6, 2024 and this Build Kansas Fund application was received on April 29, 2024.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Project Overview

The City of Dodge City, Kansas, with support from Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT), and Ford County, is pleased to submit this application for the Rural Surface Transportation Grant program (Rural) through the Multimodal Project Discretionary Grant Opportunity (MPDG) for the *US 56 Corridor- Re-MOO-ving Barriers to Elevate Rural America* in Dodge City, KS (**Project**). This project focuses on improving safety and expanding infrastructure to increase economic activity in the region, which increases the sustainability and global competitiveness of the nation's beef and cheese industries.

This Project proposes to improve where three highways, US-56, US-400, and US-283, converge and cross BNSF Railway, **Figure 1**. Two of the world's largest beef processing facilities, National Beef and Cargill Meat Solutions, call this convergence home. Additionally, this project area will soon be home to a new Hilmar Cheese processing plant, **Figure 2**. Expanding the existing bridge, increasing efficiencies of the intersections, and adding multimodal facilities, will increase safety, reduce congestion, remove barriers for employees, and increase the economic viability of this unique and important cross-roads.

Project Description

US 56 Corridor- Re-MOO-ving Barriers to Elevate Rural America includes two phases:

Trail Street – Final design is currently being completed and right-of-way is in the acquisition process. Funding is being requested for construction and construction engineering.

1. Trail Street: West of Underpass Road to West of US-56/US-283/US-400

- Reconstruct with additional two-way left-turn lane throughout.
- Add 10-foot multi-use trail along north side and sidewalk along south side.
- Reconstruct 300 feet of Underpass Road including a new traffic signal.

US-56/US-283/US-400 – Corridor study and conceptual layouts have been completed. Funding is being requested for design, right-of-way, utility relocation, and construction and construction engineering and management. To clarify improvements of this phase, descriptions are split into three sections:

1. Wyatt Earp Boulevard: West of US-56/US-283 to 1000 feet east of Airport Road

- Add left-turn and right-turn turn lanes at US-56/US-283
- Add eastbound and westbound left-turn lanes and a westbound right-turn lane at Airport Road.
- Improve aesthetics to become an entrance to Dodge City from the east.

2. US-56/US-283 Bridge: Wyatt Earp Boulevard through Trail Street

- Redeck existing bridge and widen from 2-lanes to 4-lanes.
- Add 10-foot multi-use trail along west side.
- Relocate access to Butter and Egg Road from US-56/US-283/US-400 to Trail Street east of the project area.

3. Trail Street and US-56/US-283/US-400 Intersection


- Convert existing at-grade intersection to a single-point urban interchange (SPUI).
- Operational improvements to intersection with Love's Travel Stop.



FY 2025 / 2026 Multimodal Project Discretionary Grant

Project Location

The project is located at the convergence of three US Highways: US-56, US-283, and US-400 on the east side of Dodge City, Kansas within Ford County. This convergence is essentially the east bypass around Dodge City and provides connectivity for interstate traffic from New Mexico, Oklahoma, and Colorado through Kansas, **Figure 1**. The Project also acts as the eastern and southeastern gateways into Dodge City.

Project Budget

Dodge City is requesting a total of \$38,101,399 in MPDG funding (75%) to address operational, safety, and equity issues at the heart of nation's beef industry. A total of \$12,700,466 non-federal funds (25%) will be provided by Dodge City (2.5%), Ford County (2.5%) and the State of Kansas' Build Kansas Fund, **Table 1**.

The requested MPDG funding will be utilized for construction costs and construction engineering and management for the Trail Street phase. A contingency of 5 percent is proposed as improvements are currently in final design.

MPDG funding is for design, right-of-way, utility relocation, construction costs, and construction engineering and management for the US-56/US-283/US-400 phase. Based on initial concepts, it is anticipated that minimal right-of-way will need to be acquired. For the budget, a contingency of 20 percent is being proposed. Current unknowns include utility relocation costs, geotechnical impacts, and landscape and aesthetic improvements.
