#### **Project Overview**

The City of Coffeyville seeks funding from the U.S. Department of Transportation for funding available through the Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) program for their Coffeyville Road Safety Audit and Traffic Engineering Study for US-166 Corridor project which includes conducting a Road Safety Audit and traffic engineering study along the city's US-166 corridor to identify safety improvements and reduce crashes.

This opportunity is a discretionary IIJA program with a local match requirement of 20% of the total project cost. The entity is requesting \$30,000.00 from the Build Kansas Fund, and is providing a local match of \$10,000.00. This request has the potential to unlock \$160,000.00 in federal funds, for a total project cost of \$200,000.00.

The deadline was June 26, 2025, and this Build Kansas Fund application was received on June 16, 2025.

### City of Coffeyville – FY25 SS4A Planning and Supplemental Activities Proposal

Road Safety Audit and Traffic Engineering Study for US-166 Corridor

#### Overview

The City of Coffeyville, located in southeastern Kansas near the Oklahoma border, serves a population of approximately 8,826 and is the largest city in Montgomery County. With significant industrial, educational, and healthcare assets—including Coffeyville Community College, Coffeyville Regional Medical Center, and several major employers—the city's roadway network supports thousands of daily trips by residents, commuters, and freight vehicles. This proposal seeks federal assistance through the SS4A Planning and Demonstration Grant to conduct a Road Safety Audit (RSA) and traffic engineering study along the US-166 corridor—identified in the Southeast Kansas Comprehensive Safety Action Plan (May 2025) as one of the region's highest-risk corridors.

#### Location

US-166 is a state highway and principal arterial running through Coffeyville's core commercial district, connecting residential neighborhoods, downtown, and industrial areas. According to KDOT crash data (2018–2022), this corridor has experienced over 90 crashes, including 8 involving pedestrians and 2 fatalities—a crash rate significantly higher than citywide averages. Key intersections at Buckeye, Willow, and Walnut Streets have frequent rear-end and angle collisions, many occurring during peak school and commuter hours.

The corridor also lacks modern pedestrian safety features: fewer than 25% of crossings have marked high-visibility striping, and no signalized intersections include Leading Pedestrian Intervals. Sidewalk coverage is inconsistent, creating challenges for students, seniors, and low-income residents, many of whom rely on walking or transit for daily needs.

#### **Response to Selection Criteria**

- Safety Need: Coffeyville's per capita crash injury rate is 35% higher than the state average, with pedestrian and turning-movement crashes concentrated on US-166. Over 40% of students at nearby schools walk or bike, and community feedback through the 2023 Housing and Transportation Survey highlighted unsafe crossings and poor lighting as major concerns.
- Safety Impact: The proposed RSA will provide data-driven, site-specific recommendations to reduce crashes, such as implementing LPIs, revising signal timing, and improving crosswalk visibility. These improvements are expected to significantly reduce pedestrian-vehicle conflicts, shorten crossing distances, and enhance overall corridor safety. Results will directly inform prioritization for infrastructure funding and project development under the existing Southeast Kansas Safety Action Plan.
- Engagement and Collaboration: The City will coordinate with the Southeast Kansas Regional Planning Commission, USD 445 (school district), emergency responders, and neighborhood organizations. A stakeholder working group will help define corridor priorities, and at least two public workshops will be held to gather community input and validate recommendations. Spanish-language materials and youth engagement will be integrated to reach historically underrepresented populations.

• **Supplemental Planning Activities**: This proposal includes expanded data collection, targeted traffic and pedestrian analysis, and a formal Road Safety Audit. These activities are designed to complement and advance the existing regional Action Plan, focusing on implementation-ready safety strategies for US-166.

### **Project Readiness**

Coffeyville has managed over \$10 million in federal and state infrastructure funding over the past five years and has established internal capacity to oversee transportation planning projects. The City will contract with a qualified traffic engineering firm to complete the RSA, under staff leadership from the Community Development and Public Works Departments.

The project is scheduled to begin November 1, 2025, and be completed by October 31, 2027, allowing adequate time for coordination, analysis, public input, and reporting. To support the required 20% local match, the City is applying for \$30,000 through the Build Kansas Fund. The remaining \$10,000 will be provided through City funds. The full local match will be in place prior to project kickoff. The City is ready to proceed upon award, with support from regional partners and clear alignment with broader safety goals.
