#### **Build Kansas Fund Cost Share Expectation**

Beginning in July 2024 and moving forward, the following guidance is to be used by eligible applicants to meet the expectation of providing a local share or contribution to the non-Federal match requirement, in addition to the Build Kansas Fund contribution to the non-Federal match requirement.

Cash and/or in-kind contributions should be significant enough relative to the Build Kansas Fund request to demonstrate the eligible applicant's commitment to the project. For a local public entity, 5% of the non-federal match is a good guideline, but not a requirement.

The portion of the non-Federal match requirement provided by the eligible applicants (the applicant cost share) should be cash and/or in-kind contributions. See section below for example of in-kind contributions and calculations.

**Exclusions:** Eligible applicants may provide detailed written justification and be granted an exception to or exclusion from the Build Kansas Fund cost share expectation. If an eligible applicant cannot meet this cost share expectation or has other reasons why they should be excluded from this expectation, they may justify that in their Build Kansas Fund application. Eligible applicants that team together on an application or demonstrate regionality may also be considered for exclusion on a case-by-case basis.

### **Applicant Cost Share Expectation** (8/21/2024)

- ✓ Eligible applicants are expected to contribute a portion of the non-Federal match requirement.
- ✓ This contribution can be in the form of cash and/or in-kind contributions.
- ✓ The goal is to demonstrate the applicant's commitment to the project.
- ✓ The contribution should be significant. For a local public entity, 5% of the non-federal match is a good guideline, but not a requirement.



# **Applicant Cost Share Expectation – Exclusions** and Justifications (8/21/2024)

- ✓ Eligible applicants who cannot meet the cost share expectation can provide detailed written justifications.
- ✓ Exceptions or exclusions from the cost share expectations may be granted based on valid reasons.
- ✓ Collaborative applications or regional projects may also be considered for exclusion on a case-by-case basis.


Return on Investment (ROI)



### **Technical Assistance (TA) Over Time**













### **SS4A Background**

#### **Track 1: Planning and Demonstration Grants**


- Purpose: help applicants develop, complete, or supplement a safety action plan, as well as carry out demonstration activities that inform an action plan.
- 3 different types of allowable activities:
  - 1. Develop a comprehensive safety action plan.
  - 2. Conduct supplemental safety planning to enhance an existing safety action plan
  - 3. Carry out demonstration activities to inform the development of, or an update to, a safety action plan.
- An applicant may apply for multiple allowable activities in one application, e.g., develop a comprehensive safety action plan and demonstration activities to inform the development of that safety action plan.

### **SS4A Background**

#### **Track 2: Implementation Grants**

- Purpose: help applicants implement strategies or projects that are consistent with an existing action plan that addresses roadway safety problems.
- Funds may also be used for supplemental planning and demonstration activities as well as planning, design, and development activities for projects and strategies identified in an action plan.
- Applicants are encouraged to include supplemental planning and demonstration activities in their application.




### **FHRC Exemption request**

"...The participating communities—such as Emmett, St. George, Onaga, Riley, and others—are small, rural municipalities with limited budgets and staffing capacity. These jurisdictions often face significant challenges in meeting local match requirements due to constrained general funds and a lack of discretionary revenues.

Given these financial limitations, no other sources of match funding can be leveraged at this time. The absence of a match contribution is not due to lack of effort, but rather to the fiscal realities of these rural communities."
